Along with other troop members, he has volunteered at Scouting for Food, Adopt-a-Road and environmental cleanups at every weekend campout. Bhatia has also volunteered to mentor younger scouts, both as a den chief and as a summer camp assistant, all while earning numerous badges.

"For merit badges, you have to take initiative and do the work," Bhatia says. "It requires discipline. You definitely have to work hard and push yourself. What we learn in scouts helps us later in life, too."

According to Troop 234 Scoutmaster Joel Owens, at the young age of 14, Bhatia has nearly completed all requirements as a Life Scout and is almost in reach of the rank of Eagle Scout. "One of the things that stands out for me about Bhatia is his desire to excel at all he does and to balance his time and priorities in order to participate in a wide variety of efforts," says Owens.

A Family's Civic Tradition

But Bhatia's volunteering efforts do not stop with the Scouts. This high school freshman, along with his older sister, Sarena, and his mother, Sonia, volunteered with the Red Cross to assist the displaced victims of Hurricane Katrina. And Sameer's efforts within the community have not gone unrecognized.

Mahamood also volunteers within the family's religious community. Meanwhile, Sonia holds a doctorate in psychology, has been named volunteer of the year for Seminole Healthy Start Coalition and has earned the President's Award for community service through her work with the American Red Cross. And Sarena is currently enrolled in a volunteer program called Service Leadership Congress through the family's faith community.

A Cultured Teen

When Sameer isn't volunteering, you can find him practicing the oboe, drums or piano. He began playing the oboe in elementary school, and, for the past two years, he has been selected for Seminole County's All-County Middle School Honors Band. He has earned superior medals for his oboe solos for three consecutive years. But his love of music doesn't stop there. Sameer has a passion for drumming and will be on Lake Mary High School's drumline this fall.

In addition to his musical interests, Sameer has recently unearthed his acting talent. This past year, he took an advanced acting class in school and discovered an affinity for musical theatre. He played Horton the elephant in the school's production of "Seussical Jr.," portraying the earnest, caring and beleaguered Dr. Seuss character to great reviews and earning the Rising Star award from his drama teacher. He attended his first District Thespian Festival and came away with a superior medal for his monologue and Best in Show award for a duet pantomime.

Suzanne Reeves, Greenwood Lakes Middle School drama director, has taken notice of Sameer's talent in theatre. "I believe that Sameer has been 'bitten' by the acting bug, and acting is in his blood," says Reeves. "He definitely has a natural talent and is truly a rising star."

With his numerous extracurricular activities, Sameer still finds time to study, constantly earning a place on his school's honor roll. This rising star adheres to his family's "failure is not an option" motto and, with the support of our community, will continue to shine.
